Babylove & the van Dangos
feat. Daimi, Pato & Per Vers

Babylove & the van Dangos get together with a diverse group of musicians from Copenhagen to brew beer, play reggae and build toilets i Ghana.

The ever first reggae song in Danish was performed by the legendary Danish singer and actress Daimi Gentle. Back in 1966 she had a nationwide hit with a danish rewrite of the classic "Shame and Scandal in the Family".

Now she's back where it all started as Babylove & the van Dangos has teamed up with Daimi, hip-hop talent Pato and rapper/freestyler extraordinaire Per Vers to create the song "Boogaloo on Brown Ale Avenue". The song is a part of a larger benefit concert in Copenhagen that Babylove & the van Dangos are putting on in order to collect 4000 € for a very special development project in Ghana.

The world renowned Copenhagen based microbrewery "Mikkeller" is brewing a very special beer for this event only based on Ghanaian herbs and spices and artist John Kenn Mortensen has drawn the label. The beer, as well as the song, is called "Boogaloo on Brown Ale Avenue" and all profits from the sales as well as all profits from the concert will go towards the funding of 10 toilets in the small Ghanaian village Dzogadze. In Dzogadze people live in clay huts, collect water from the river and don't have any toilets. The benefit project is 100% Babylove & the van Dangos initiative and it is the chiefs from the village that has decided on building the 10 toilets for the money that is being raised.
